MODERATOR'S REFLECTIONS LONG ISLAND PRESBYTERY MEETING: April 30, 2022

Greetings! May the peace of the Lord be with you all.

We just had a hybrid meeting at Faith Presbyterian Church (Great Neck). The exterior of the church building looked the same, but the interior was completely new. Somethings were old, yet many things were given new look and vitality. The church is open again with new hearts. And I think this church serves as an excellent metaphor for our April meeting. Let us become Matthew 25 churches.

The commissioning of the GA commissioners was also very special. They are the bridges that connect us to our larger church. Let us pray for their preparation and participation in GA.
