**Session-elected Elder Commissioners authorized to be sent to Presbytery meetings**

**Equalization**

*In accordance with the form of Government, G-3.0301, the Presbytery shall adopt and communicate to the sessions a plan for determining how many ruling elders each session should elect as commissioners to the Presbytery, with a goal of numerical parity of ministers of the Word and Sacrament and ruling elders.*

The Stated Clerk has determined that the number of resident ministers of the Presbytery during the first week of January is 60. Accordingly, we propose that sessions of churches with over two hundred members will be entitled to elect two commissioners, and sessions with under two hundred members will be entitled to elect one commissioner each as per the most recent statistical report reported by the Presbytery, which will make the number of session-elected elder commissioners authorized to be sent to Presbytery meetings 63.

**Motion**

The Presbytery adopts the following plan to determine session-elected elder commissioners to Presbytery meetings: Churches over 200 members may elect two commissioners. Churches under 200 members may elect one.
